Model United Nations Intern (2 Positions Available)

Spring Internship: Approx mid-January-late April

- Interns will support the CCWA team in the execution of the Model United Nations conferences.
- Interns will manage communication and logistics of Model United Nations conferences, including tracking and recording payments, creating conference materials, developing background guides, and organizing registration and rosters.
- This internship is hybrid style, with a mix of in-person and remote work.
- Attendance at CCWA Model UN conferences is required.

International Exchanges Intern (1 Position Available)

- The Intern will draft compelling proposals and program itineraries for U.S. Department of State exchanges that showcase Cleveland as a destination for international visitors.
- The Intern will help facilitate meetings and act as a local liaison when international groups are in town.
- The Intern will help with data entry and assist with social media.
- Expected start date: mid-January 2026. This internship is in-person.

Research and Social Media Intern (1 Position Available)

The intern will support the CEO in conducting research on the impact of global

- developments on Cleveland.
- The intern will support CCWA's online and social media presence through content creation and engagement tracking.
- The intern will provide administrative and logistical support to the CEO and COO as needed.
- Expected start date is early January 2026. The intern is expected to work a minimum of 10 hours per week, with at least one day in person at the CCWA office.
